OUR COLLEGE

Adusumilli Gopala Krishnaiah Technological Association, a Registered Society was revived by KCP Ltd. in 1975 to provide higher education facilities within the door steps of the Sugarcane producing families of Vuyyuru and neighbouring villages. The Society with the support of local philanthropists and sugar cane growers started a junior and a Degree College in 13 acres of land named as Adusumilli Gopala Krishnaiah & Sugar cane Growers' College (AG & SG College), which were inaugurated on 12th August, 1975 by the Honorable Chief Minister Sri Jalagam Vengala Rao.

Velagapudi Rama Krishna and Sugarcane Growers Educational and Welfare Society formed by KCP Ltd. extended financial support to run the college. To improve the physical amenities and to strengthen the academic programs in the college, the management of the college was taken over by the KCP Ltd. in 1994. The KCP Management desired to hand over the two colleges to Siddhartha Academy of General & Technical Education in 2001-02, which came forward with a noble motive and progressive outlook to take over the management so as to serve the student community.

From a modest beginning in 1975 with 143 students, college emerged as one of the premier institutes in rural Andhra Pradesh with 1309 students and 56 faculty. New programs like B.Sc. MCCs (2018-19), B.Sc. Aquaculture (2019-20), B.Sc. MSCs (2021-22), and B.Com E-Commerce (2021-22) were introduced in addition to the existing programs. The college has Post Graduate programs of M.Sc. Chemistry (2010-11) with Organic Chemistry as specialization, M.Com (2015-16) and M.Sc. Computer Science (2016-17) for the bright future of socially backward classes in and around Vuyyuru. Certificate courses, Skill Development courses, Skill Enhancement courses, Add on courses are introduced in the college to satisfy the academic pursuit of student community. Campus recruitment training is given high priority. 135 students are placed in the academic year 2021-22. Forty seven (47) years of college in higher education has created a niche in this region by the unstinted support of the management.

In tune with the philosophy of the management which strives for progress the infra structure of the college is developed in an admirable manner. Well equipped laboratories, Library and reading room, Internet Centre, Indoor sports Auditorium, Gymnasium for both men and women, Yoga centre, E- class room with computer systems and LAN facility, Canteen, Women's hostel, common Rest rooms for girl students, Eight lane 400 meters track, Ball

badminton, Basket ball, Volley ball cricket, Kho-Kho, Tenny –Koit and Khabadi courts help the students to enrich their competence and improve themselves mentally and physically. A 25 Kv Solar Power plant and RO water plant serve the needs of the college.

The college is recognized under 2f and 12B and is affiliated to Krishna University, Machilipatnam. AG & SG College is accredited at "A" grade by NAAC securing 3.05 on a 4 point scale in 2017 (cycle-II). The college is conferred with Autonomous status from the academic year 2012 and acquired the prestigious ISO 9001:2015 certificate in September 2021.

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION (UG)

Candidates must apply online on the OAMDC portal for admissions into B.A/ B.Com/B.Sc. To get admission, candidates must have passed 10+ 2 level in the subject concerned. The eligible candidates need to register in the OAMDC portal.

Category **A** quota (Convener Quota) allotment will be made as per merit in OAMDC portal following reservations. Notification for admission under Category **B** (Management) quota will be issued by the college after the completion of the Category **A** allotment.

Fee reimbursement by the Government of A. P. is not applicable to Category B (Management) seats.

Note: Originals of all the certificates mentioned above should be produced by the applicant at the time of interview for admission. Without verification of original certificates, admission will not be granted.

(Passport size photos should be affixed in the specified places)

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION (PG)

Candidates must apply online on the APPGCET portal for admission into M.Sc., Organic Chemistry / M.Com. / M. Sc., Computer Science. To get admission, candidates should have passed a graduate degree. Eligible candidates need to appear in APPGCET for category A admissions in convener quota.

Category B (Management) quota seats allotment will be made separately after the completion of the category A seats. The college will publish the notification separately for these categories.

Fee reimbursement by the Government of A. P. is not applicable to all these admissions.

ATTENDANCE:

- Attendance of each student is strictly monitored and will be reported to the University: Government
- No student is allowed to absent himself without submitting a leave letter in advance
- Minimum attendance of 75% in theory and practical's is necessary for a student to take semester end examinations.
- If the attendance is between **62.5 74%** the prescribed condonation fee should be paid in order to write the examination
- If a student is absent even for one period either in the morning session or afternoon session, he/ she will lose half a day's attendance.
- A student of the first semester should seek fresh admission in the event of detention or discontinuation. Any student of II-V semester who has shortage of attendance shall be required to repeat the semester in the next academic year.
- 75% of attendance is mandatory in every month for scholarships, fee reimbursement and other benefits from the University/UGC/Government and Management

EXAMINATIONS

- The examination system is classified into two parts
 - a. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA)
 - B. Semester-End Examination (**SEE**)
- Student should get 40% in order to get through the examinations.
- All candidates have to answer the question papers in the medium as specified in their applications for admission into the course. No change of medium will be permitted thereafter.
- No student will be allowed to take examinations without the payment of fee.
- Student will not be promoted to next semester, if they do not pay current semester examination fee.
- **Grace Period**: A student who is not able to complete his/her degree studies within 3 years, is given a maximum period of 6 years from the date of admission to appear for his/her supplementary examinations to complete the degree course.

Internal Assessment Examinations under Choice Based Credit System CBCS:

For I& III-year Degree Students (SEM I, II & V, VI) out of 100 marks in each paper, 30 marks shall be allocated for continuous internal assessment.

Out of these 30 marks, 20 marks are allocated for Continuous Internal Assessment tests (i.e. CIA-1 & CIA-2). Two Internal Assessment tests will be conducted and average of these two tests shall be deemed as the marks obtained by the student. 5 marks are allocated on the basis of candidate's percentage of attendance, 5 marks are allocated for assignment / class room seminars, group discussions and other components for B.A./B.Com/ B.Sc.

For II Year Degree Students (III & IV semesters) out of 100 marks in each paper, 25marks shall be for continuous internal assessment. Out of these 25 marks, 15 marks are allocated for Internal Assessment tests (i.e.CIA-1 & CIA-2). Two Internal Assessment tests will be conducted and average of these two tests shall be deemed as the marks obtained by the student. 5 marks are allocated on the basis of candidate's percentage of attendance and remaining 5 marks are allocated for the assignment.

- Each internal assessment test is held approximately after 40 or 45 days of instruction.
- Two tests will be conducted per day and for 1-1 ½ hour duration.

Semester - End Examination:

- The maximum marks for I & III Degree Semester End Examination shall be 70 marks and duration of examination shall be 3 hours.
- The maximum marks for II Degree Semester End Examination shall be 75 marks and duration of examination shall be 3 hours
- Semester-End examinations in theory and practical's shall be conducted at the end of every semester.
- College conducts as many Certificate Courses as possible in different subjects for the benefit of the students and society.

Revaluation:

- A candidate can apply for revaluation of any paper in any subject within one week of the declaration of results.
- If the difference of marks in first and second valuation is 20 for UG and 20% for PG, the answer script will be sent for a third valuation.
- The average of any two highest valuations will be considered as the final marks of the candidate.
- If a student is benefited with 10 marks or more, or if a failed student passes in revaluation 50% of the fees paid for revaluation will be refunded.

• Malpractice:

- The college takes a serious view of the unfair methods in all theory and practical examinations.
- If a student is caught for malpractice in the SEM end or CIA examinations he / she is not allowed to write the remaining examinations.
- In all cases of malpractice, the decision of the Malpractices Committee is final. The
 committee will follow the rules and regulations related to malpractice cases which are
 approved in the Academic Council.

GUIDELINES TO STUDENT

Admission

- ✓ Students are advised to read the prospectus carefully, before filling up the application form.
- ✓ They should clearly understand all aspects of the program they want to choose and are solely responsible in making correct choice of the program, to which they want to seek admission. All admissions are governed by the rules communicated from time to time by Krishna University, Machilipatnam / Govt of A.P
- ✓ Students must be careful in enclosing all the required documents to the application form, while submitting for registration. Defective and incomplete applications in any manner will be summarily rejected.
- ✓ Students are advised to keep at least six attested copies of all their certificates SSC/Intermediate, Pass-cum-Marks Memo, Caste certificate, Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate, Income certificate etc., with them before submitting the originals to the College office at the time of admission.

DISCIPLINE

- Discipline is the key note of the collegiate life; strict discipline shall be maintained at all times on the college premises.
- All students must follow the rules and regulations of the college. They should keep the college campus clean and green, for a healthy environment.
- Use of Cell Phones by the students in the class rooms is strictly prohibited.
- No student is allowed to enter or leave class room without prior permission of the Lecturer concerned.

- When a student is asked to leave the class by any lecturer for whatever reason, he/she must immediately obey the instruction. Failure to do so will be construed as an extremely serious violation of the disciplinary rules and the erring student/s, run the grave risk of expulsion, subject to final decision by the Principal, after hearing the student's grievance, if any.
- Students can approach the Principal either personally or through the staff members of
 Teacher-Ward Counseling System to obtain solutions to any of their legitimate
 problems pertaining to education.
- All the students of the College are expected to behave politely towards the staff members, and maintain harmonious interpersonal relations among them.
- Any charges of misconduct by student/s in any manner on the campus or outside the
 campus involving the college reputation will be handled by the College Disciplinary
 Committee consisting of teaching staff constituted by the Principal. Disciplinary action
 will be taken basing on its report and the information available with the Principal. The
 decision of the Principal shall be final in such matters.
- A seat offered is liable to be forfeited if the student absents himself/ herself for more than 15 days without a proper leave letter.
- The student should attend the classes promptly and regularly.
- The parent or the guardian of a student must give an undertaking to the effect that he knows the rules and regulations of the college, and his/her ward will be regular to the college and will maintain good character and conduct during the course of his/her study in the college. The parent—should note his/her ward academic progress. They have to accept the punishment or penalty levied by the college authorities in case of violation.
- Students who fail to rise up to the required average academic standard may approach the faculty concerned, for improvement.
- No student must be a member or sympathizer of any Organization, which directly or indirectly affects the discipline of the college.
- Students are not permitted to resort to strikes and demonstrations illegally, and are not permitted to participate in any such activity.
- All the rules and regulations made by the College from time to time are bound on all the students.

Student Dress Code

To inculcate a sense of discipline, oneness, unity and a bond of brotherhood among the students the following uniform is prescribed, from Monday to Saturday in every week.(except Friday)

Boy-students: Trousers-- snuff (dark) colour

Shirt-- cream & snuff checks.

Girl- students: Punjabi dress with cream & snuff checks Top

Snuff coloured bottom & Chunni.

Foot wear: Shoes or Chappals.

- All the students must attend the college in neat and normally tailored uniform. All the boy-students are expected to attend the college with neat and normal hair-cut.
- Students who do not come in the prescribed uniform will not be allowed to the classes. Students are permitted to attend the college in civil dress on Fridays only.

Identity card

- ✓ Every student will be provided with an identity card which should be worn around the neck in the college.
- ✓ He / she must produce the identity card whenever required by the office / departments on academic or administrative matters.
- ✓ The student should bring the ID card along with the hall ticket to write the theory and practical examinations.

Ragging

- Ragging is prohibited in this institution. The rules framed under "A.P. Prohibition of Ragging Act 26 of 1997 will be implemented against all those who violate the Act and rules.
- In case any students are found indulging in ragging in any form within or outside the campus, concerned action will be taken by the Anti Ragging Cell of the college.
- The admission of such student/s will be refused or they will be expelled from the college.
- Ragging entails heavy fines or even punishment.

Extracurricular activities

- ✓ Various Committees will be constituted by the Principal, as per the needs of the College, to achieve required goals. The students should respond to the demands of the said Committees, if required.
- ✓ There are NCC and NSS units for both boys and girls in the College. The intake will be limited to the prescribed strength. Hence, students should make a choice in seeking enrolment in the said organizations, in accordance with their interest, and as early as possible.
- ✓ We offer information required by the Public as per the **Right to information Act**, 2005.

Co-curricular Activities

- Learning outside the class room and thinking out of box are the paradigms in the college.
 Emphasis is given on co- curricular activities in order to ensure the holistic development of students.
- Internship is mandatory after the end of 2nd and 4th semester examinations and in 5th or 6th semester with respect to all UG programs.
- Other activities include students led events, seminars, workshops, field trips and student competitions. Leadership qualities are nurtured with these activities among students

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE INSTITUTION

LIBRARY

- The college has a prestigious library with an excellent collection of 24,092 volumes which includes Text books, Reference books, Competitive Books, Encyclopaedias and Dictionaries etc.
- The library is under the supervision of a professional librarian.
- Our library is fully automated providing web-based OPAC (Online Public Access
 Catalogue) and circulation through bar-code system. Open Access System will be
 followed to enable the students to select the library books of their own choice.
- 100 seating capacity is available for reference and reading room.
- E- Resources like N-LIST (sponsored by INFLIBNET) are subscribed. 306 Back volumes of journals are available for reference.
- The library remains opened on every working day from 8.30 A.M. to 5.30P.M. The library remains closed on Sunday and on all recognized holidays.

Reading Room

• The reading room is showcased with more than 30 journals/ magazines and 8 news papers for the use of students and staff.

• Net Resource Centre

• Net Resource Centre housed in reading room consists of 8 computer systems, to serve free internet to students and staff from 8.30 A.M. to 5.30P.M. High speed internet connectivity with 75 Mbps facility is available to the students.

LABORATORIES

- Science students can enter the laboratories only during the scheduled hours of work, and at other times if permitted by the teaching staff of the department.
- A student shall be answerable for the careless handling of the apparatus supplied to them for work.
- All breakages are charged and are payable at the end of the year or earlier if the Principal decides so. A student shall not leave the laboratory until he/ she returns the apparatus to the laboratory attenders.
- A student shall perform 90% of the practical exercise covering the prescribed courses to get eligibility to appear for the public Examination.

Botany Lab:

Botany department has the necessary infrastructure for conducting the experiments at UG level by using equipment and instruments like Laminar air flow, Hot Air Oven, Incubator, Digital PH meter, Digital Spectrometer etc.

Chemistry Lab:

Centralized laboratory is established with the sophisticated equipment like Calorimetry, UV-Visible double beam spectrophotometer; double distil water plant, Conductometer, Ultra centrifuge machine, Skip's apparatus, Potentiometer etc. Fume hoods are installed in all chemistry laboratories.

Physics Lab:

Physics laboratory is established with advanced digital electronics equipment like Logic gates. A travelling microscope used for measuring length with a resolution typically in the order of 0.01mm is available in the laboratory. A Cathode Ray Oscilloscope used to measure and analyse

various wave forms of electrical circuits is one of the most important equipment used in the laboratory. A Sonometer, Microprocessor Kit and a Microcontroller are accessible in the Lab.

Computer Lab:

The Computer Science Department has 3 fully fledged Labs and one server. The laboratories are equipped with 74 computer systems with higher configurations and latest licensed soft ware. Each lab has a projector to assist e-learning.

Statistics Lab:

The college provides a well equipped Statistics laboratory for MSCs students to learn skills and various statistical analysis methods for different types of data. All the Computer systems are upgraded to meet the requirements of changing technology and syllabi.

Zoology Lab:

Zoology laboratory is well established with Electronic microscopes, Medical microscopes, Digital PH meter, digital salinity meter etc. The instruments for clinical science have been installed for good practical knowledge. Haemocytometer, blood group testing kit, are some of the gadgets available in the laboratory. LCD projector is available in the laboratory by which teaching and learning capabilities are enhanced.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LABORATORY

- A well equipped English Language Laboratory exists in the college to enhance the employability of the under graduate students by imparting oral and aural skills.
- These oral and aural skills have been incorporated into the General English curriculum.
- The lab is based on the methodology of LSRW skills that are listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- Digital language lab allows a student to interact, study and experiment with the language skills in a practical manner. In language lab soft ware is a blend of technology that helps in easy and fast learning of English skills.

E- Class Room

- The college is equipped with e- class room with a minimum seating capacity of 100 to enable the students and staff with world class teaching experience via audio- visual teaching methodologies.
- Our college has introduced an active learning atmosphere through the state of art eclassroom facilities.

• The class room is used to develop communication skills in team based projects, apart from curriculum prescribed course work.

GAMES & SPORTS

- Games are an integral part of learning to infuse the students with a team spirit and channelize their energy into fruitful accomplishments all students are encouraged to participate in games and sports.
- Annual Sports meet is held within the campus. The students whole heartedly participate
 in the sports events after an intensive training from the Physical director of the college Sri
 P. Chandrababu.
