9. Ratified the following proposed Amendments

9.1 Evaluation of Academic Achievement of Student:

The academic performance of the student in all Courses (Languages, Core courses, Life skill courses, Skill development courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Lab courses) in a semester is evaluated by internal and external examiners. Achievement in every Course is evaluated in the ratio of 30: 70 between CIA (Continuous Internal Assessment) and SEE (Semester End Examinations).

9.2 Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA):

Internal Assessment shall be conducted both in theory courses and laboratory work. Out of a maximum of 50 marks in a practical course, 15 marks shall be allotted for Continuous Internal Assessment. For purpose of computing marks for CIA, each practical is evaluated for 10 marks in the respective lab session and all the marks awarded are totalled and reduced to a maximum of 15.

9.3 Out of a maximum of 100 marks in each theory course, 30 marks shall be allotted for Internal Assessment. The teacher handling that course, in the manner prescribed hereunder, shall make the assessment.

Theory Courses having Maximum Marks of 100: The academic achievement of the student is evaluated by the teacher concerned. Out of the five units of the syllabus, two and half units are considered for the first Internal Assessment Test and two and half units are considered for the second Internal Assessment Test.

CIA Marks Allotment:

The marks scored by the student in the two tests are aggregated and proportionately reduced to a maximum of 20 marks.

- 9.4 If a Student is absent for either or both the tests due to medical reasons, participation in Sports/NCC/NSS/Youth Festival or such other activities/Camps/ competitions at National or International Level, prior permission from the Principal shall have to be obtained. Such permission copy shall be submitted in the office of Controller of Examinations. The Head of the Department shall see that extra lab sessions are conducted for compensating the loss of practical classes due to such participation. The teacher shall have to conduct CIA test/ tests to such students after informing the Head of the Department immediately after the semester end examinations. Marks statement shall be sent to the Examination section through the Head of the Department.
- 9.5 The valued answer scripts of the first internal assessment tests should be made available to the students within 10 days from the completion of the tests. The scripts of the second internal assessment tests shall be valued within 10 days from the date of the tests or 7 days before the last instructional day whichever is earlier. The valued scripts shall be given to the students for their personal verification in one of the class hours and collected back in the same hour.

- 9.6 Redress of grievance: If a student is not satisfied with the marks awarded in Internal Assessment, she may bring it to the notice of the teacher evaluator. If she is not satisfied with the criterion for award of marks explained by the teacher, she may request the Principal in writing within three working days from the notification of marks, to redress her grievance, whereupon the Principal shall refer the grievance to Grievance Redressal Committee consisting of the HOD and another Teacher (other than the teacher evaluator) of the same department. The decision of the Grievance Redressal Committee shall be final. The Head of the Department shall ensure that the Continuous Internal Assessment system is transparent and credible. The total marks compiled for CIA shall be displayed on Departmental Notice Board.
- 9.7 Final computed CIA statements relating to all theory and lab courses shall be displayed in the department within 3 days from the last instructional day and sent to the COE within 7 days from the last instructional day after rectifying the discrepancies, if any raised by the student.
- 9.8 Schedule of internal assessment of the students shall be decided by the Heads of the Departments in consultation with the Controller of Examinations.
- 9.9 Failure in or absence from semester-end examinations in the Course shall not cause forfeiture of marks scored by the candidate in the Continuous Internal Assessment in that Course. The marks scored in Continuous Internal Assessment shall be carried forward.

10. Semester-end examination:

10.1 Semester-end examinations shall be conducted in theory and practical courses at the end of every semester.

10.2 The maximum marks for semester-end theory examinations shall be 70 where the Max marks of the course is 100 (CIA+SEE) and the duration of the examination shall be 3 hours. In case of Courses (Life Skill Courses and Skill Development Courses) with maximum 50 marks (CIA+SEE) semester-end examination is for a max. marks 40 and duration of theory examination shall be 2 hours and all Lab Course examinations shall be 3 hours.

10.3 The Controller of Examinations in consultation with the Heads of Departments and approval of the Principal shall fix the dates of semester-end examinations.

10.4. For semester-end examinations, the question paper/s of Part-I, II & III shall be set by External Paper-setter and the answer scripts shall be valued by the external examiner.

10.5 A candidate, who fails to pass in semester-end examinations of Part-I/II/III, may take the examination in the course in which he/she failed either in the supplementary examination conducted

at the end of / during the next semester or along with the candidates of the subsequent batch at the regular Semester-End Examinations as the case may be.

10.6 **Passing and classification regulations:**

A candidate who secures at least 40% marks in the Semester-End Examination and 40% marks in aggregate (i.e., marks in Continuous Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination taken together) shall be declared to have passed in that course. In case of visually challenged, the pass mark shall be reduced by 10%.

10.7 In order to be eligible for a Rank, Award, Goldmedal, Distinction, Prizes and similar commendation, a candidate must have appeared and passed all the courses in the respective Semester-End Examinations only.

i) CGPA shall be given separately for Part-I, Part-II and Part-III on the basis of marks secured which are converted into grade points.

ii) A candidate to be eligible for the award of higher class/division shall pass all courses of Part-II earlier to or along with 6th semester end examination passing 6th semester courses in one attempt and Part-I courses earlier to or along with 4th semester examination passing the papers of Part-II in one attempt.

iii) Date of passing Part-III will not affect the division either in Part-I or Part-II.

iv) A candidate shall be considered to have passed in First class, in Part-I /Part-II if she secures CGPA 6.0 or more.

- v) A Candidate shall be considered to have passed in Second class, in Part-I/Part-II if she secures CGPA 5.0 or more, but less than 6.0.
- vi) All other candidates whose CGPA is less than 5 and more than 4 shall be declared as passed in Third class.

11. Rules and Regulations applicable to Post Graduate Programmes for the students admitted in 2022-'23 and onwards

11.0 FUNCTIONING OF AUTONOMY:

The Post graduate programmes in the college are offered on Semester basis. Each academic year is divided into two semesters (1) Odd (Monsoon) semester (2) Even (Winter) semester. A semester consists of at least 90 instructional days (excluding the days of examination). The medium of instruction shall be English.

11.1 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

- a) Admission is given generally into I Semester of the programme. The eligibility rules for Admission to these programmes shall be as prescribed by Krishna University.
- b) Admissions shall be made strictly following the reservation policy of Government of Andhra Pradesh.

11.2 CURRICULAR REFORMS:

- a) The College follows the Programme structure of Krishna University for all its Post Graduate Programmes
- b) Life Skill Course: Every student of a post graduate programme in the College should study and pass the life skill course "Personality Development through Life Enlightenment skills" across all disciplines as part of curriculum for the award of degree.
- c) Skill Enhancement Course: Every student of a post graduate programme in the College should study and pass "Research Methodology and IPR" as part of curriculum across all disciplines for the award of degree.
- d) INTERDISCIPLINARY OPEN ELECTIVE COURSE: There shall be at least one Open <u>Elective</u> in Second or Third semesters wherein the student has to choose out of a basket of Courses offered by other departments. They should be interdisciplinary should be interdisciplinary in nature.

e) MOOCs : Students are required to register and complete one Massive Open Online Course (MOOC- minimum of 40 hours duration) for 4 credits offered by SWAYAM / NPTEL sources approved by the Head of the Department. It is mandatory that student has to register for and pass the MOOC course in any semester during the term of the programme. The Examination Section of the College shall arrange for Semester End Examination in the MOOC for the students who failed the examination of Course conducting Teacher of SWAYAM /NPTEL. The grade scored by the student in such College Examination shall be downgraded by one grade.

- The Heads of the departments shall ensure that every student is enrolled into the recommended MOOC in any semester. Heads of the Departments (HoD) are responsible to nominate one Mentor, who supports the students for the successful completion of the MOOC
- The Heads of the departments shall ensure that the syllabus, model question paper and list of paper setters / examiners for the MOOC chosen by the students are recommended by Board of Studies (BoS) of respective course.
- Mentors are responsible to support the students towards the successful completion of the MOOC They should connect with the student and conduct special classes on the registered MOOC.

f) SUMMER INTERNSHIP:

Every student shall undergo Internship/ Apprenticeship / Project Work / Industrial Training /Research based Project Work for a period of 6 weeks at the **end of Second Semester** between Second and Third Semesters. The student shall prepare a Report as per the approved project guidelines and submit the same to the HOD for evaluation at the end of Fourth Semester.

12. Minimum and Maximum Duration of the Programme:

Normally, a student should complete an undergraduate programme within the term of the programme i.e., 3 years. However, if the student is not able to complete the programme, two or three more years are allowed for the student to complete the programme as per the rules of parent university, Krishna University.

13. Grading System:

On passing a course of a programme as per Rule 10.1 the student shall earn the credits assigned to that course.

- Implementation of University guidelines for conducting Supplementary examinations to the outgoing students on one time opportunity basis must be justified and a copy may be sent to the members of the Academic Council for the approval.
 - A copy of University guidelines for conducting Supplementary examinations on a one-time opportunity basis for the outgoing students is sent to the Academic Council for approval.
- All the departments are advised to initiate more activities in the non-instructional hours by organizing career counselling classes, Student Seminars, Yoga, Sports/ Library etc., for the benefit of the students.
 - It is decided to increase the number of activities in the non-instructional hours by engaging the students in N.C.C/N.S.S/Sports/Cultural etc., by utilizing the facilities available in the college.
- The Department of English is advised to make the students listen to BBC News in the noninstructional hours.

- Abiding by the suggestions, The Department of English is decided to make necessary arrangements to broadcast the BBC News in the evening time by using the LCD Projector in the English language laboratory.
- All the departments are advised to encourage students for internships and list out the nearby organizations for Community Service Project and Internship programmes.
