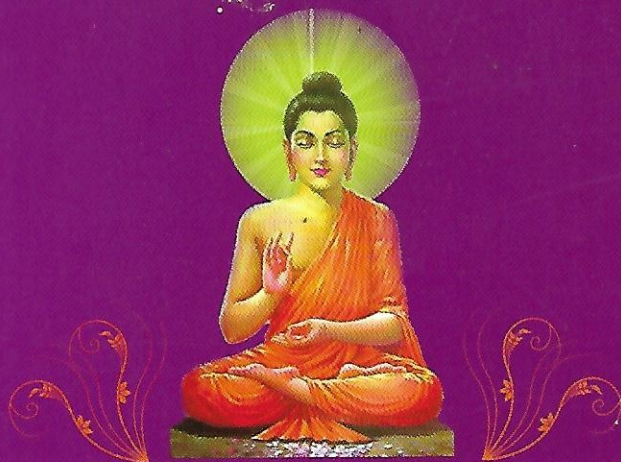

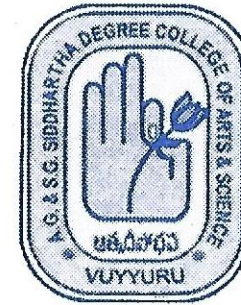

OUR COLLEGE

Adusumilli Gopala Krishnaiah Technological Association, a registered society, was revived by KCP Ltd in 1975 to provide Higher Education facilities within the door steps of the Sugarcane producing families of Vuyyuru and neighbouring villages. This society took the support of the local Philanthrophists and sugarcane growers and started a Degree and Junior College under its Management with the name and Titled as "Adusumilli Gopal Krishnaiah & Sugarcane Growers College" (A.G. & S.G. College), which were inaugurated on 12th August, 1975 by the Honourable Chief Minister Sri Jalagam Vengala Rao.

'Velagapudi Rama Krishna and Sugarcane Growers Educational and Welfare Society' formed by KCP Ltd extended the financial support to run the college. In the inception year 1975, 143 students were enrolled in B.A; B.Com and B.Sc (Telugu Medium) Courses in the Degree College. Now, the enrollment of students took momentum and raised to 804 by the year 2013-14 in the Degree College. B.Sc. (MPC & BZC) English Medium Section was started in the year 1980-81 to accommodate more students. The College was admitted to Grant-in-Aid from 01-06-1981.

To improve the physical amenities and to strengthen the academic programme in the college, the Management of the College was taken over by the KCP Ltd in 1994. A new section, B.Sc. (Computer Science) under self-financing was introduced in the academic year 1998-99

The KCP Management, reputable in its rich experience in Industrial Sector, desired to hand over the two colleges to "Siddhartha Academy of General & Technical Education" Vijayawada, which gave a thrust and momentum to the field of Education and spread its message of "pursuit of excellence" by establishing many Educational Institutions in and around Vijayawada.

Siddhartha Academy of General & Technical Education came forward agreeing to take over the management of the colleges with a noble motive and progressive outlook to serve the student community of sugar cane growers and all socially backward classes in and around Vuyyuru, from the academic year 2001-02 onwards. Under the management of Siddhartha Academy the college started another section in B.Sc. (M.P.C.) English Medium and a Post Graduate Course in M.Sc. (Chemistry) with Organic Chemistry as specialization. A new section B.Com(Computers) under the self financing was introduced in the academic year 2013-14

Infrastructural Facilities

In tune with the philosophy of the Management, which strives for progress many developmental works were performed in the college. In brief they are...

1. First and Second floor buildings were constructed on the Library Building, giving provision to PG class rooms and AC Computer Lab for English and Commerce Departments.
2. Construction and Modernization of the Seminar Hall on the Canteen Building.
3. Construction of Chemistry Laboratory Building for UG and PG courses with matching grants from UGC and management.
4. Construction of Women's Hostel to provide accommodation to girl students was completed with a matching grant from UGC and Management and is open for UG and PG girl students from the academic year 2011-12.

5. A separate building was constructed as common room/rest room for girl students with a matching grant from UGC and Management.
6. An additional class room with a matching grant from UGC and Management was constructed near the canteen building.
7. An e-class room with 30 computer systems and LAN facility was established with Rs.25 lakhs from UGC grants and is useful for all Aided courses.
8. 'Sri Vadde Sobhanadri Indoor Sports' Auditorium was constructed with Rs. 97 lakhs with UGC assistance.
9. Eight lane 400- meters track, Ball-Badminton, basket ball, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Volley ball and Tenny-Koiti Play courts are open to all the students in the morning and evening hours.
10. The Indoor sports facilities and Gym for both men & women separately available in morning and evening hours.

Ours is an autonomous college and the CBCS (Choice Based Credit system) has been implemented from the academic year 2015 - 2016.

Postgraduate Course in Chemistry :

A Postgraduate Course in M.Sc. Chemistry was started with specialization in Organic Chemistry from the academic year 2009-10. In this course, 30 seats will be filled up in the counselling centre by the University based on the ranks obtained in the Entrance Examination and additional 6 seats (from the year 2010-11) will be filled by the Management as per norms of the University. The details of fee may be obtained from the College authorities for Management Quota seats.

PG in Commerce (M.Com.)

A Post Graduate course in Commerce (M.Com.) was started from the academic year 2015-2016. In this course 40 seats will be filled up in the counselling centre by the University based on the ranks obtained in the Entrance examination.

PG in Computers (M.Sc. Computers)

A Post Graduate course in computers (M.Sc) was started from the academic year 2016-17. In this Course 40 seats will be filled up in counselling centre by the University based on the ranks obtained in the entrance examination.

V. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO COURSES

1. Students seeking admission to any course in this college must submit their applications in the prescribed form to the Principal duly filling in all the columns and enclosing attested true copies of certificates and other forms.
2. Students, who desire to apply for more than one group, are advised to apply separately for each combination.
3. The candidates are informed to make their own arrangements to ascertain from the college authorities regarding their selection, and the college will not be responsible in any way, if the candidates do not receive intimation in time due to postal delay and the like.
4. Application forms can be obtained from the college office on payment. The filled in applications must be registered personally in the College Office.
5. Applications for registration are to be accompanied by the following documents and / or papers.
 - i) Two certified copies of the marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
 - ii) A certified copy of the conduct certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last studied.
 - iii) A certified copy of the Transfer certificate issued by the Institution last studied by the applicant.
 - iv) Matriculates and CBSE students should also submit two certified copies of:
 - a) Pass certificate
 - b) Certificate of date of birth
 - c) Migration certificate in the case of candidates who passed their Matriculation from the Universities other than the affiliating University.

Note: Originals of all the Certificates mentioned above should be produced by the applicant at the time of Interview for admission. Without verification of Original Certificates, admission will not be granted. (Passport photos should be affixed in the specified places)

RULES OF ADMISSION

1. All correspondence with the college should be addressed to the Principal of the college by designation and not by name.
2. Admissions are made on the basis of credentials presented in the applications. No seats are reserved by correspondence. Admissions are made purely on the basis of merit and rules of reservation to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Listed Backward Classes, Physically Challenged, Minorities, Women, and other categories as per the norms prescribed by the Government of Andhra Pradesh from time to time.
3. No admission will be made without a personal interview of the candidate by the admitting authority in the office of the Principal during working hours and on the stipulated date. No request for any permission to join at a later date will be entertained. Vacancies, after considering the merit list, will also be filled up from the waiting lists on merit basis and as per rules of reservation.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING FEE PAYMENT

1. (a) Fee must be paid within the stipulated date.
(b) Fine will be levied for delayed payments.
(c) The names of the defaulting students will be struck off the rolls thereafter.
(d) If any student, who cancels his/her admission after the admission process is over, shall forfeit the amount already paid. In self-supporting courses, such student has to pay 50% of the balance of fee also payable to the College, had he/she continued in the College till the end of the Course. In the event of cancellation of admission, original certificates will be returned only on payment of the said amounts as mentioned above.
(e) Any student who has not paid the fee on time or cleared any dues on account of fines or breakages or any other amounts due to the College for any reason within the date and time prescribed shall forfeit his/her admission and readmission, if given, will be treated as fresh admission.
2. Fee concessions / Scholarships will be paid only according to Government provisions to the students of Scheduled

Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Listed Backward Classes and Economically poor Communities subject to their submission of necessary application forms along with all enclosures (e.g., Caste, Income Certificate etc.) in time to the College Office, and/or when ever intimated by the College Office. Students, who fail to submit the same, will have to pay all fees to the College. The balance of fee not reimbursed by the Government will be collected from the students.

3. No Transfer Certificate will be issued until all dues to the College are paid
4. Other fees, if any which are required to be paid, will be intimated at the time of admission, or in the subsequent semesters.

III. ATTENDANCE AND EXAMINATIONS

Attendance of each student is strictly monitored and will be reported to the University/Government. No student is allowed to absent himself without submitting a leave letter in advance. 75% of attendance is mandatory in every month for Scholarships. Fee reimbursement and other benefits from the University/UGC/Government/Management.

A minimum attendance 75% in theory and practicals is necessary for a student to take Semester End Examinations. Internal Assessment Examinations under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS:)

- * For I & II year Degree Students (SEM I, II, III & IV) out of 100 marks in each paper, 30 marks shall be allocated for Continuous Internal Assessment(CIA).
- * Out of these 30 marks, 20 marks are allocated for announced tests (i.e. IA-1 & IA-2). Two announced tests will be conducted and average of these two tests shall be deemed as the marks obtained by the student. 5 marks are allocated on the basis of candidates's percentage of attendance, 5 marks are allocated assignment / class room seminars for B.A./B.Com/B.Sc.
- * For III Year Degree Students (i.e. V and VI semesters) out of 100 marks in each paper, 25marks shall be for internal assessment. Out of these 25 marks, 15 marks are allocated

for announced tests (i.e. IA-1 & IA-2). Two announced tests will be conducted and average of these two tests shall be deemed as the marks obtained by the student, 5 marks are allocated on the basis of candidates's percentage of attendance and remaining 5marks are allocated for the assignment.

Semester - End Examination :

- * The maximum marks for I & II Degree semester - End examination shall be 70 marks and duration of examination shall be 3 hours.
- * The maximum marks for III Degree Semester - End examination shall be 75 marks and duration of examination shall be 3 hours
- * Semester End Examinations in theory papers and practical examinations shall be conducted at the end of every semester (SEE) I, II, III, IV, V & VI for I, II & III B.Sc. College conducts as many Certificate Courses and Diploma Courses as possible in different subjects for the benefit of the students and society. Library, Network Resource Centre and Career Guidance & Placement Cell is open to all students from 9am to 6pm on all working days.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GOLD MEDALS

College provides equal opportunity to apply for all categories of scholarships to the eligible students. They are as follows....

- (a) State Government Scholarships for SC/ST/BC/MIN/EBC etc...
- (b) Central Government Post Metric and Merit Scholarships.
- (c) UGC (Merged Schemes) funded Conveyance Allowance to the students coming from more than 10km distance.
- (d) UGC stipend for SC/ST/BC/MIN/EBC/PHC etc... students on academic merit basis.

The following Gold Medals and Cash Scholarships are instituted in our college by some philanthropists for specific purposes.

- (4) "Sri Y. Lakshmi Prasad Gold Medal " for Topper in Mathematics.
- (5) "Sri Madala Kasi Visweswara Rao Memorial Cash Prize of Rs. 2500/-" for the First Degree student who studied in A.G. & S.G.S Junior College and stood Topper in the Junior College.
- (6) "Sri V.M.Rao Memorial Gold Medal" for the Topper in the First and Second Degree Public Examinations put together.
- (7) "Sri K. Venkatramaiah and Smt K. Adi Sheshamma Memorial Gold Medal" for the Topper in English subject of First and Second Degree Public Examinations put together.
- (8) Sri Madala Kasi Visweswara Rao Memorial cash Prize for the Highest Marks in BZC group (5 semesters) in our Degree college.
- (9) A cash prize of Rs. 4,000/- for the outstanding sports person awarded by the college. for men : 2000/-,for women:2000/- "A Welfare Fund for Poor and Meritorious Students" was instituted from the academic year 2011-12.

Group Insurance to Students :- Our college provides Insurance benefit to every student and his /her parent to extent of Rs.1,00,000/-in the case of accidental death with a nominal premium of Rs.90/- per year.

GUIDELINES TO STUDENT

1. Students are advised to read the prospectus carefully,before filling up the application form.
2. They should clearly understand all aspects of the course, rules and regulations of the College, and are solely responsible in making correct choice of the course, to which they want to seek admission. All admissions are governed by the rules communicated from time to time by Krishna University, Machilipatnam/Govt of A.P
3. Students must be careful in enclosing all the required documents to the application form,while submitting for registration. Defective and incomplete applications in any manner will be summarily rejected.
4. **The college reserves to itself the right not to offer instruction in any subject or combination of subjects or courses in which the enrolment is found inadequate in the opinion of the college authorities.**
5. There are NCC and NSS units in the College. The intake will be limited to the prescribed strength. Hence, students should make a careful choice in seeking enrolment in the said Organizations,in accordance with their interest,and as early as possible,after seeking admission into the Course. A scrutiny will be conducted,if more applicants are in queue for enrolment.
6. **Students are advised to keep at least six attested copies of all their certificates SSC/Intermediate,Pass-cnm-Marks Memo, Caste certificate,Transfer Certificate,Conduct Certificate, Income certificate etc., with them before submitting the Originals to the College Office, at the time of admission.**

DISCIPLINE

1. discipline is the key note of the collegiate life in this College. Strict discipline shall be maintained at all times on the college premises.

2. No student is allowed to enter or leave class room without prior permission of the Lecturer concerned. When a student is asked to leave the class by any Lecturer for whatever reason, he/she must immediately obey the instruction. Failure to do so will be construed as an extremely serious violation of the disciplinary rules and the erring student/s run the grave risk of expulsion, subject to final decision by the Principal, after hearing the student's grievance, if any. Students can approach the Principal either personally or through the staff members of **Teacher-Ward Counseling System** to obtain solutions to any of their legitimate problems pertaining to education.
3. All the students of the College are expected to behave politely towards the staff members, and maintain harmonious interpersonal relations among them. The students should keep the college campus clean and green, for a healthy environment. Any charges of misconduct by student/s in any manner on the campus or outside the campus involving the college reputation will be handled by the **College Disciplinary Committee** consisting of Teaching staff constituted by the Principal. Disciplinary action will be taken basing on its report and the information available with the Principal. The decision of the Principal shall be final in such matters.
4. A seat offered is liable to be forfeited unless the student attends the classes promptly and regularly, and if the student absents himself/herself for more than 15 days without a proper leave letter.
5. Students seeking admission should physically and mentally be sound in health. Any one who fails to undergo the medical examination by the College Medical authority or found unfit even after admission will be issued a Transfer Certificate.
6. The parent or the guardian of a student must give an Undertaking to the effect that he knows the rules and regulations of the college, and his/ her ward will be regular to the College and will maintain good character and conduct during the course of his/ her study in the College. That he will attend to the college if required and note his/her ward academic progress. They have to accept the punishment and/or penalty levied by the College authorities in case of violation.
7. Students who fail to rise up to the required average academic standard may approach the Faculty concerned for improvement, which will be in the interest of maintaining standards of education in this college. Failure to do so on the part of any student will result in disciplinary action by the College authorities.

8. To inculcate a sense of discipline, oneness, unity and a bond of brotherhood among the students of the College, the following uniform is prescribed, from Monday to Saturday in every week:(except Friday)
 - Boy-students : Trousers-snuff (dark) colour
Shirt-Cream & snuff checks.**
 - Girl- students : Punjabi dress with Cream & snuff checks
Top and snuff coloured bottom & Chunni.**
 - Foot wear : Shoes or Chappals.**
 All the students must attend the college in neat and normally tailored uniform. All the boy-students are expected to attend the college with neat and normal hair-cut. Students who do not come in the prescribed uniform will not be allowed to the classes. Students are permitted to attend the College in Civil dress on Fridays only.
9. Students willing to participate in **Sports and Games, Literary and Cultural** activities must enroll their names with the organizer and use opportunities to prove their talents.
10. No student must be a member or sympathizer of any Organization, which directly or indirectly affects the discipline of the college.
11. Students are not permitted to resort to strikes and demonstrations illegally, and are not permitted to participate in any such activity. Any such violation will attract punishment.
12. Various Committees will be constituted by the Principal, as per the needs of the College, to achieve required goals. The students should respond to the demands of the said Committees, if required.
13. Whenever necessary, a Central Assembly will be conducted by the Principal for declaration of important and urgent issues pertaining to the students and the College.
- 14. Use of Cell Phones by the students in the class rooms is strictly prohibited.**
15. All the rules and regulations made by the College from time to time are bound on all the students.
16. In case any student is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or/ and if it is noticed later that he has indulged in

ragging, the admission of such student/s will be refused or such student/s will be expelled from the college, if admitted.

18. We offer information required by the Public as per the Right to information Act, 2005.
19. Ragging is prohibited in this institution. The rules framed under "A.P. Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997" will be implemented against all those who violate the Act and rules

THE LIBRARY

The College has a good computerized library, which provides internet facility at free of cost to all students and staff members. The students should frequently visit the library to complete their class work by intelligent reading of their subject, and also to form their mind by good reading of general nature. The library is under the supervision of a professional librarian.

Open Access System will be followed to enable the students to select the library books of their own choice.

The library remains opened on every working day from 9.00 A.M. to 5.30 P.M. The library remains closed on Sunday and on all recognized holidays.

LABORATORIES

Science students can enter the laboratories only during the scheduled hours of work, and at other times if permitted by the teaching staff of the department. A student shall be answerable for the careless handling of the apparatus supplied to them for work. All breakages are charged and are payable at the end of the year or earlier if the Principal decides so. A student shall not leave the laboratory until He/ she returns the apparatus to the laboratory attenders. A student shall perform 90% of the practical exercise covering the prescribed courses to get eligibility to appear for the public Examination.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LABORATORY

A well equipped English Language Laboratory exists in the college to enhance the employability of the under graduate students by imparting oral and aural skills. These oral and aural skills have been incorporated into the General English curriculum.

GAMES & SPORTS

All students are encouraged to participate in sports to ensure overall development of mind and body. Facilities are provided for Hand Ball, Volley Ball, Ball Badminton, Kho-Kho, Net Ball, Basket Ball, Track and field events as well as indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess and Carroms. A well equipped gym is also available in the campus.

Outdoor Stadium

Outdoor stadium was established with 8 lane 400mts. Track with other playing facilities.

The Management gives equal importance to the Physical Education along with the course curriculum. To encourage sports the Management offers Awards and fee concession for the outstanding players.

E Class Room

To promote ICT learning and make teaching more effective an e-class room is established on the campus.

OFFICE

Administrative office will work even during the lunch break for consolations as well as payment of fees for convenience of students

CANTEEN

The college has spacious and well equipped canteen. It provides healthy food to satisfy the food needs of the students and also provides necessary items to the hostel students.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

Grievance redressal cell constituted by the Principal shall deal with all grievances pertaining to academic/ administrative/ disciplinary matters.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

A career Guidance and placement Cell is established on the campus to guide the students and bring the career opportunities to the notice of the students. The placement officer guides the students to appear for the campus interviews.

CULTURAL & LITERARY ACTIVITIES

The college gained great reputation at National Level in the cultural field. The College gives ample score for students to participate. in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities conducted in and outside the college. Students who want to avail themselves of this opportunity may contact the conveners of the Literary and Cultural Associations.

Certificate Courses

Certificate Courses in Yoga, Journalism, Spoken English, Competitive English will be conducted in our college. Every Student must complete two certificate courses during the three years degree course. These certificate courses are useful to get extra credits.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The objective of introducing the N.S.S. in the institute of higher education is to provide opportunities to teachers and students to gain practical experience in community service. The Programme Officer has to conduct 1) Regular Activities and 2) special Campaign Programmes.

Under the regular activities N.S.S. Volunteers are expected to participate in institutional projects, rural & urban projects and emergency relief works usually on Sundays and if needed on other days also outside the college hours. Special campaign Programmes -Special camps of 10 days duration will be conducted during Vacation period.
